#### FROM THE MINISTER

The December theme is wonder. I don't know about you, but wonder is one of my very favorite words, one of my very favorite feelings to experience. The holidays – with their lights and trinkets, their warm and inviting darkness, their blessings of visitors, their unexpected snowfalls – are very much associated with wonder in my mind.

And: I write this in the wake of another two mass shootings in America – at a Wal-Mart in Virginia, and at a LGBTQ+ nightclub in Colorado Springs.

I wonder...if it is trivializing to even speak of wonder at a time like this.

And yet wonder is more than just a nice feeling to have at a carol sing. We wonder at the world when we open our hearts to new insight, new learning, to doubt and growth. Violence is the antithesis of wonder. As Ted Lasso puts it, "be curious, not judgmental." When we are curious – when we wonder – we are not in the frame of mind to attempt to dismiss, control, belittle, or destroy, like the pathways of violence.

Life really is wonderful. Be curious, not judgmental. Don't try to grab it like an AR-15 rifle; be open to it like a new puppy. Let us be committed to wonder.

Speaking of wonder, you may be wondering what's happening with staffing and communication here at Unitarian Universalist Congregation of the Catskills. To keep you up to date on all the changes:

- In September we thanked our Office Administrator, Laurie Nash, after three devoted years of service here. Laurie resigned after a tenure marked by dedication, care, and service.
- During the summer, we employed Amanda Williams as our marketing consultant. Amanda helped us redesign our communications and website, helping to clarify our reach and extend our voice in the community. After Laurie resigned, Amanda agreed to stay on temporarily, in a limited capacity, to produce our newsletters and weekly emails until we found a new Office Administrator.
- We are delighted to announce that Sarah Bissonnette-Adler has accepted our offer to be Office Administrator, on a contract basis. Sarah will be managing our newsletter, office email, rentals, and helping with our website and marketing. Some of you know Sarah, who served as Office Administrator from 2013 to 2019. She also grew up in this congregation. Welcome, Sarah, thank you for taking on this call!

- The ministerial search is ongoing. My term as your Developmental Minister ends in June, 2023. I'll miss you! But it's the right time for me to go, and you deserve, and will have, excellent leadership. Different lay leaders, ministers, and staff have answered the call over the years, and that will remain the case in years to come.

Denominational News: There is a major revision of Article 2 being proposed. Article 2 of the Unitarian Universalist Association outlines the "principles and purposes" of our faith and, as such, is foundational to what it means to be part of the UUA. Previously, Article 2 contained the "seven principles" (originally six, they were amended and added to since their adoption in 1961) and six sources. If this change is adopted, it would change to a new document, based on shared values.

If approved for review by the UUA Board, Article 2 would be voted on by the entire UUA membership, first in June 2023 and, if approved to go forward, in a final vote in June, 2024.

There will be a chance for individual comment on the latest draft in December or January. I hope to speak more about this proposed change in early 2023. But it's important you get to read the proposal for yourself, reflect on it, and suggest any changes you feel called to make. Thanks!

#### FROM THE TREASURER

#### 2022 Tax Deductions

UU Catskills is a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization. As such, your donations are tax deductible. As we near the end of the year, this is the perfect time to make an additional tax-deductible donation for 2022. Or perhaps you'd like to pay the balance of your 2022-23 pledge at this time. Please submit your payments to the Treasurer by December 21st. This will ensure they are deposited before the end of the calendar year.

# FYI- WHERE DO YOUR PLEDGES & DONATIONS GO?

AAs you already know, your donations are used to support our minister, our staff and our facilities. But more and more frequently, your donations are needed to support the extra and sometimes unexpected expenses of running and maintaining our Buildings and Grounds. This quarter we paid \$2150 to replace the Farmhouse gutters, \$1800 to remove the dead maple tree in front of the Farmhouse, and \$2915 to prepay the Farmhouse oil bill. We are fortunate that we have a tenant in the Farmhouse during the week which offsets some of the expenses, but the cost of unexpected Farmhouse maintenance has continued to exceed income. Also this month our annual fees to the UUA are due, \$8721. We are grateful for the extra donations we received recently, and thankful to all of you for paying your pledges in a timely manner.
