## From the Minister

March's monthly topic is vulnerability.

I don't know about you, but I had to be taught how to be vulnerable. It didn't always come naturally to me. I thought you just had to "keep a stiff upper lip", not show the cracks. I have been fortunate to be in groups where people I greatly respected – people with wisdom, compassion, great leadership qualities – would express their vulnerability. Admit they had their doubts about themselves sometimes. Say out loud that they didn't know for sure if they were right. Ask for help from others.

Through these mentors, I came to understand that vulnerability is not the opposite of strength. Being willfully unaware of one's own flaws – and our basic humanness – isn't strength at all. It's much stronger to be able to say, "I'm just one imperfect person doing my best, but I am doing the best I can on this one, and together, who knows what we might accomplish." Through these vulnerable people – of all genders and ages and backgrounds – I have learned the strength and collective power of vulnerability.

## From the UU Catskills President

Our theme for March is vulnerability. We feel most vulnerable when we step outside our comfort zones to take on a new role or project that challenges us to grow and move beyond ourselves. Yet, isn't this the very calling of life as it seeks to overcome the spirit of gravity that strives to hold us fast? Much of our March agenda focuses on change—the changing seasons to be sure, but also changes to our mission, our ministry, and even to our principles.

On March 12, the Board will conduct a follow-up service on Volunteering and Vulnerability: Stepping Out of Your Comfort Zone, during which we will hear from several leaders about their path to service within our congregation. Following Service, there will be another opportunity for those of you looking to get more involved to meet with members of the various UU Catskills committees and groups. Throughout March, there will be series of cottage meetings (on March 14, 18 and 30) to discuss where we are as a congregation and where do we go from here—important questions to ask as we head into our Pledge Campaign and our Ministerial Search. And finally, there is the unfolding of the Eighth Principle, and the proposed revision to Article II of the UUA Bylaws (watch for further discussions of these two important issues).

Lots of potential change with lots of ways to get informed and let your voice be heard. Come to the Board Service and to one of the Cottage Meetings. Step out of your comfort Zone and get involved in a committee or group. UU Catskills can only truly be ours, if all of us engage in its unfolding together.

Thoughts after our All Congregation Read of 'Mistakes and Miracles:

Congregations on the Road to Multiculturalism'

In chapter one the authors state "it is our culture and not our theology" that is the biggest obstacle for UUs trying to work toward creating more inclusive congregations -but that should offer us hope! A congregation can't get anywhere in the work of building a beloved, multicultural, antiracist community until they understand how the concept of white

privilege is at work in their lives and their institution. A congregation has to reach a tipping point in the number of white folks who understand the concept of white privilege in order to be able to make progress.

"Understanding white privilege" is shorthand for awakening to this country's system of racial hierarchy.

The term 'white supremacy culture" is also used to mean the same thing and while it may conjure up images of hoods and mobs, it is used to describe the "set of institutional assumptions and practices, often operating unconsciously, that tend to benefit white people and exclude people of color". In the 2020s actual 'white supremacists" are not required in order to uphold white supremacist culture. Building a faith full of people who understand that key distinction is essential as we work toward a more just society.
